

MOVIE REVIEW | THE PLATFORM

The Platform is a Spanish science fiction horror-thriller film, directed by Galder Gaztelu-Urrutia and released in 2019. The concept of the movie is quite impressive and clever. Entire film takes place in a jail like place simply termed as "The Hole", which consists of 333 floors and 2 persons per hole. Every day, a platform with a lot of food descends through a large hole in the middle of the building, and it's only one chance for food for entire day. It holds in at one floor for only two minutes the prisoners have to eat as much as they can within two minutes and cannot keep any food with them after that. The prisoner at level one, have access to a feast with lot of varieties of food. The people at the successive lower floor have to eat food left from successive top-level people. If everyone only ate small amount of food, it could make it all the way to bottom with something for each prisoner. But it never happens. The main character of the film is Goreng, who volunteered to enter the prison to quit smoking. Every prisoner was allowed to take only one thing with them which may be sword, knife, rope and anything they


want. In case of Goreng he took book with him. He entered the hole without properly understanding it. His first cell mate who was a old man explain him about the process of hole, however later on he have to kill that old man. He was in level 48 at that time. The level changes every month. The more one goes to lower level it's harder for survival because one had to feed on the left overs from the upper level. Eventually food will be less and less leading to no food left for people at lower level. This caused the serious conflict at the lower level there will be brutal battle for food and survival. For the survival the prisoners killed their own cell mates and eat their body for the month, even if the body gets rotten. And this reflects how the hunger changes a rational human being into dangerous animal.

The movie is the clear reflection of our society. It mainly emphasis on the social hierarchy, social inequality, struggle of survival, social dynamics and so on prevailing in our society. The movie focuses on the idea unequal distribution of resources and power are root cause of conflicts. The social parable is clear – if the haves didn't take more than they needed, there would be enough for have nots. The film evilest part and most clever part was idea of changing floors every month because all the prisoner has equal probability to be in higher or in lower floor. One can be on 8th floor one month and then on 148th floor next month. But whoever comes to upper floor their mentality of superiority always leads to take more food than needed causing less food left for lower levels.

This movie is suspenseful, dramatic and somehow horror simply the reflection of our selfish world. It has multiple impressive twists given in its limited setting, and each of them casts a new light on aspects of our society. This movie is now on Netflix for millions of people to watch. It is really a good movie to watch especially during quarantine days.
